

## REPORT OF THE NCAA BOARD OF GOVERNORS COMMITTEE TO PROMOTE CULTURAL DIVERSITY AND EQUITY DECEMBER 3, 2020, VIDEOCONFERENCE

## ACTION ITEMS.

- 1. Legislative items.
  - None.
- 2. Nonlegislative items.
  - West Coast Conference's Bill Russell Rule.
    - (1) <u>Recommendation</u>. NCAA Board of Governors review the West Coast Conference's newly-adopted Bill Russell Rule at its next scheduled meeting, endorse the rule in principle for the Association and explore ways NCAA membership institutions may implement the rule in compliance with state employment laws and regulations.
    - (2) Effective date. None.
    - (3) Rationale. The NCAA Board of Governors Committee to Promote Cultural Diversity and Equity was established to review, endorse and make recommendations regarding diversity and inclusion matters that impact the Association. In addition, the committee promotes, supports and advocates for policies and approaches that enhance diversity and inclusion in collegiate athletics. To this end, at its August 2020 meeting, CPCDE examined the West Coast Conference's adoption of the Bill Russell Rule, which requires each member institution to include a person from a traditionally underrepresented community in a pool of final candidates for every athletics director, senior administrator, head coach and full-time assistant coach position in the athletics department. In an effort to support diverse hiring practices throughout the Association, the committee identified the Bill Russell Rule as a best practice for the membership and discussed meaningful ways to support the Association's adoption of diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives like the Bill Russell Rule. CPCDE acknowledges how various state employment laws and regulations create challenges for enacting NCAA policy or legislation and determined the rule could be endorsed in principle by the Board of Governors for the Association.
    - (4) Estimated budget impact. None.
    - (5) <u>Student-athlete impact</u>. Diverse representation in leadership throughout the Association better reflects and serves the increasingly diverse student-athlete population.
