- 1. Review committee report. The committee reviewed and approved the report from its June 26, 2025, teleconference.
- **2. New grading scale for British Columbia (Canada).** The committee reviewed and approved the addition of a proficiency-based grading scale for Grade 9 for British Columbia (Canada). This will be published in the next available update to the Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility, and will appear as follows:

3. Review of the 1st4sport Level 3 Diploma in Sporting Excellence credential from the United Kingdom. The committee reviewed and approved the addition of the United Kingdom's 1st4sport Level 3 Diploma in Sporting Excellence credential as a not acceptable form of proof of graduation in the Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility. The committee's determination was based on additional clarification from the entity 1st4sport/UK Coaching that was solicited by the committee following its May 22, 2025, teleconference. This will be published in the next available update to the Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility.

4. Review of the Intermediate Certificate for Telangana and other Educational Board-Issued Intermediate Certificates from India. The committee reviewed and approved the addition of the Intermediate Certificate for Telangana and other Educational Board-Issued Intermediate Certificates from India as acceptable proof of high school graduation. These credentials will all have a 12-year timeline (four years or 8 semesters from initial enrollment in year nine) and be considered category two for old model purposes. These credentials will be combined with those Intermediate Certificates for Goa and Andhra Pradesh already listed in the Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility and will appear as follows:

- 5. Review of the Euka Assessed/University Pathway credential from Australia. The committee reviewed and approved the Euka Assessed/University Pathway credential as acceptable proof of high school graduation for all Australian territories. The Euka Assessed/University Pathway credential will have a 12-year timeline (four years or 8 semesters from initial enrollment in year nine). The credential will be considered category two for old model purposes. This will be published in the next available update to the Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility.
- 6. Review of the Euka Assessment-Free Pathway credential from Australia. The committee reviewed and approved the addition of the Euka Assessment-Free Pathway credential as a not acceptable form of proof of graduation for all Australian territories. This will be published in the next available update to the Guide to International Academic Standards for Athletics Eligibility.
