| Organized competition legislation.        | Issued a blanket waiver of the organized competition legislation to permit a prospective student-athlete, who has not previously enrolled full- time at a collegiate institution and whose legislated grace period concluded prior to or during the 2021-22 academic year, to engage in organized competition during the 2021-22 academic year without using a season of competition, provided the prospective student-athlete did not utilize the previous COVID-19 relief in the 2020-21 academic year.  A prospective student-athlete may use the approved COVID-19 relief to waive only one season of competition for participation in organized competition before initial full-time collegiate enrollment. | 5/6/21               |

| Student-athlete housing blocks.   | Issued a blanket waiver for the 2021-22 academic year to permit institutions to make housing arrangements as determined to be necessary with COVID-19 considerations, including student-athlete specific housing blocks.  | 6/2/21               |
