

Division II Recruiting Calendars for Sports Other Than Football and Basketball

Please note this document should not be used as a substitute for the NCAA Manual.

Coaches are encouraged to contact the athletics compliance office for additional information.

Due to the review of Division II Bylaw 13 (recruiting) by the Division II Legislation Committee over the past few months and the potential legislative changes that may result from that review, there will be an updated version of the 2024-25 Recruiting Calendars published later on in the summer.

Men's and Women's Wrestling

July 22-28, 2024, the Monday before the National Wrestling Coaches Association Convention through the day of adjournment of the convention.

DEAD PERIOD

Nov. 11 (7 a.m.)-Nov. 13 (7 a.m.), 2024, during the 48 hours prior to 7 a.m. on the initial date for the signing of the National Letter of Intent.

Recruiting periods defined

QUIET PERIOD

A quiet period is that period of time when it is permissible to make in-person recruiting contacts only on the member institution's campus. No in-person, off-campus recruiting contacts or evaluations may be made during the quiet period.

DEAD PERIOD

A dead period is that period of time when it is not permissible to make in-person recruiting contacts or evaluations on or off the member institution's campus or to permit official or unofficial visits by prospective student-athletes to the institution's campus.

EVALUATION PERIOD

An evaluation period is that period of time when it is permissible for authorized athletics department staff members to be involved in off-campus activities designed to assess the academic qualifications and playing ability of prospective student-athletes. No in-person, off-campus recruiting contacts shall be made with the prospective student-athlete during an evaluation period.

Note: During the dead period immediately preceding the initial National Letter of Intent signing date, the National Letter of Intent cannot be hand delivered; it must be mailed.

All Other Sports

Nov. 11 (7 a.m.)-Nov. 13 (7 a.m.), 2024, during the 48 hours prior to 7 a.m. on the initial date for the signing of the National Letter of Intent.

Exceptions:

U.S. Diving National Championships

- When the dead period for recruiting occurs during the U.S. Diving National Championships, it shall be permissible for authorized coaching staff members to observe prospective student-athletes participating in that event.

North American Cup Fencing Championship

- When the dead period for recruiting occurs during the North American Cup Fencing Championship, it shall be permissible for authorized coaching staff members to observe prospective student-athletes participating in that event.

Junior Olympic or Paralympic Rifle Championships

- When the dead period for recruiting occurs during the Junior Olympic Rifle Championships, it shall be permissible for authorized coaching staff members to observe prospective student-athletes participating in that event.
