



**INFORMATION REGARDING 2019 NCAA DIVISION I  
WOMEN'S BASKETBALL COACHES' ATTENDANCE AT ELITE AND  
JUNIOR LEVEL INTERNATIONAL EVENTS AND NATIONAL TEAM EVENTS**

To assist the membership, the NCAA academic and membership affairs staff has collaborated with USA Basketball to provide a list of events women's basketball coaches may or may not attend in the upcoming months. It is important to note the list is not exhaustive and even though NCAA bylaws may permit coaches to attend an event, the governing body may limit coaches' attendance due to the importance of proper national team preparations and gym space limitations.

As a reminder, women's basketball staff members shall not exceed 112 recruiting-person days each year (measured August 1 through July 31). A coach's involvement in off-campus recruiting activities during the July evaluation periods does not count toward the limitation

Quiet period and evaluation period for nonscholastic certified events only but coaches can attend since DI coaches are involved per Bylaw 13.1.7.6.6-(a).	USA Basketball will permit one coach per institution to attend each session even though legislation permits two coaches to attend.
May 23-30, 2019.	U16 National Team Trials (USOTC, Colorado Springs, Colorado).	No. USA Basketball has closed these sessions due to space limitations and to allow for national team participation.	Closed due to space limitations and to allow for national team preparations.
June 3-7, 2019.	3x3 FIBA U18 World Cup (Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia).	Yes. Quiet period but coaches can attend per Bylaw 13.1.7.15.	No restrictions from USA Basketball.
June 5-15, 2019.	U16 National Team training camp (USOTC, Colorado Springs, Colorado).	No. Quiet period and there are no Division I coaches involved.	Open sessions will be identified by USAB closer to the start of training camp.

July 20-28, 2019.	FIBA U19 World Cup (Bangkok, Thailand).	Yes. Coaches can attend per Bylaw 13.1.7.15.	No restrictions from USA Basketball.
July 23-August 4, 2019.	Pan American Games Team training camp for 5x5 Tournament (Colorado Springs, Colorado).	Yes. Coaches may attend since Division I coaches are involved per Bylaw 13.1.7.6.6-(a).	Up to two coaching staff members may attend per calendar day.  Open sessions will be identified by USA Basketball closer to the start of training camp.
July 27-29, 2019.	Pan American Games 3x3 Tournament (Lima, Peru).	Yes. It is a quiet period; however, coaches may attend per Bylaw 13.1.7.15.	No restrictions from USA Basketball.
August 6-10, 2019.	Pan American Games 5x5 Tournament (Lima, Peru).	Yes. It is a quiet period; however, coaches may attend per Bylaw 13.1.7.15.	No restrictions from USA Basketball.
