

# In-Person Exam Sample Questions

NOTE: It should be assumed that all references to coaches, student-athletes, prospective student-athletes, etc. in the questions on the exam are specific to the sport of men's basketball. Further the term "athlete" when used without a qualifier signifies both currently enrolled student-athletes and prospective student-athletes.
