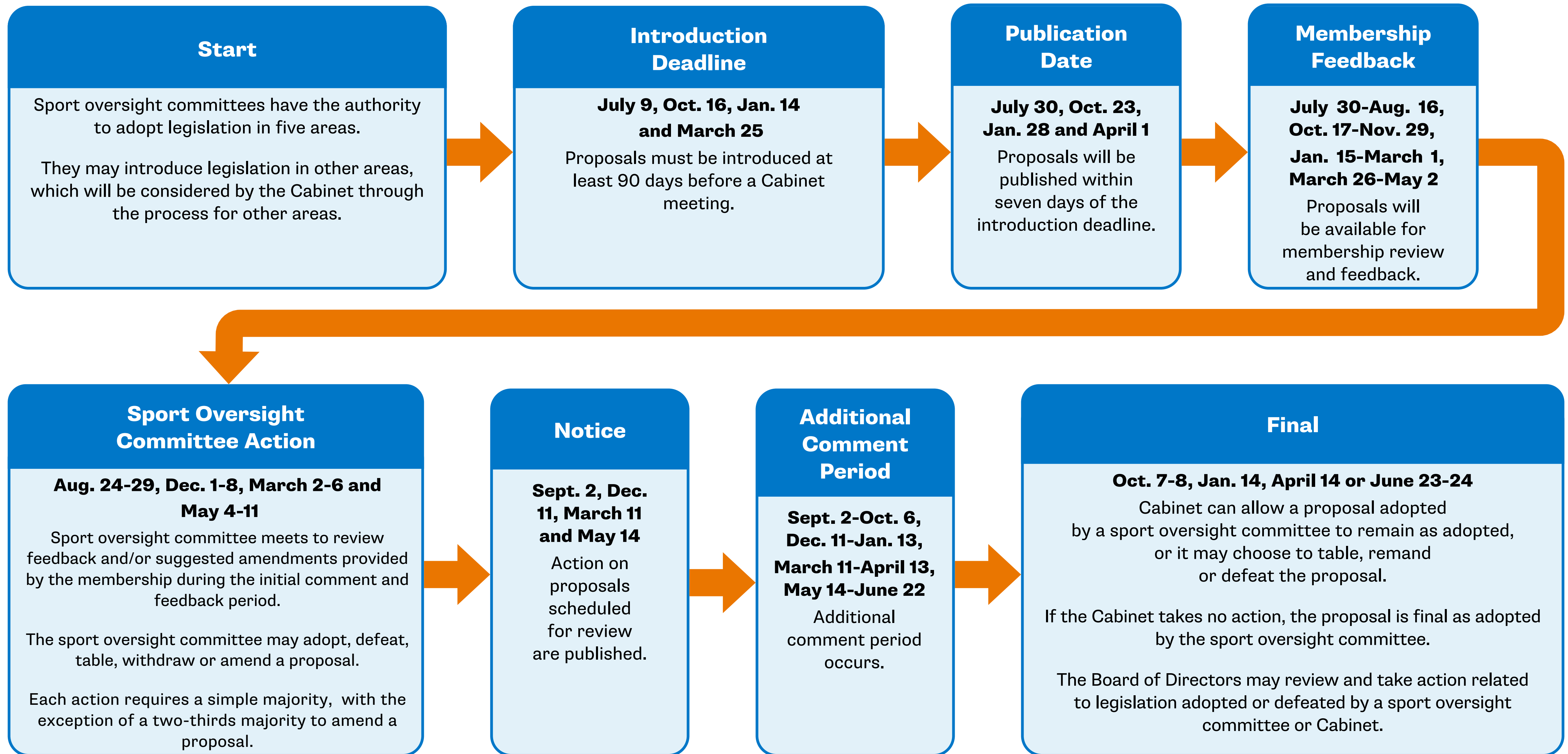


Sport Oversight Committees Legislative Process

Have the authority to adopt legislation related to their sport in the following areas: 1) Conduct of athletics personnel (NCAA Bylaw 11); 2) Recruiting (NCAA Bylaw 13); 3) Playing and practice seasons (NCAA Bylaw 17); 4) Processes and procedures related to the administration of the regular season and championship (NCAA Bylaw 31) and 5) Sportsmanship and other ethical behaviors.

Outline of Possible Actions for Sport Oversight Committee Legislative Change



- ▶ **Adopt** (simple majority vote).
- ▶ **Defeat.**
- ▶ **Table** (simple majority vote, sunset after 6 months if the proposal is not addressed).
- ▶ **Withdraw** (simple majority vote).
- ▶ **Amend** (2/3 majority vote).



- ▶ **Take no action**, which means the proposal is final as adopted by the oversight committee.
- ▶ **Affirm adoption** (simple majority vote).
- ▶ **Defeat** (2/3 majority vote).
- ▶ **Remand to committee** to address specific issues (simple majority vote).
- ▶ **Table** (2/3 majority, sunset after 6 months if the proposal is not addressed).
- ▶ **Amend** (2/3 majority).
The Cabinet can adopt the proposal as amended (simple majority vote), defeat the proposal (two-thirds majority vote), send the proposal into an additional comment period (simple majority vote), or table (two-thirds majority vote).

Legislation adopted by an oversight committee is considered final at the conclusion of the applicable Cabinet meeting, subject to review by the Cabinet as noted above.
