

Presidential Grouping



Current.

- The Division III Philosophy Statement (Bylaw 20.11) articulates principles
 that represent a commitment to Division III membership and shall serve as a
 guide for the preparation of legislation by the division and for planning and
 implementation of programs by institutions and conferences.
- The current statement consists of 18 principles.
- The statement has not been substantively revised since 2012.



Proposed.

- A working group within the Division III Strategic Planning & Finance Committee drafted proposed changes to the current version of the Philosophy Statement, with extensive input from the membership.
- The proposed changes consider elements already contained in the NCAA Constitution while articulating fundamental principles of the division and would replace the existing Philosophy Statement in its entirety.
- Would amend the Philosophy Statement, only.


Proposal 2024-1 Philosophy Statement Language	Current Philosophy Statement (Bylaw 20.11)
The purpose of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) is to assist its members in developing the basis for consistent, equitable competition while minimizing infringement on the freedom of individual members to determine their own unique objectives and programs. The philosophy statement articulates principles that represent a commitment to Division III membership and shall serve as a guide for the preparation of legislation by the division and for planning and implementation of programs by institutions and conferences.	The purpose of the NCAA is to assist its members in developing the basis for consistent, equitable competition while minimizing infringement on the freedom of individual institutions to determine their own special objectives and programs. The above statement articulates principles that represent a commitment to Division III membership and shall serve as a guide for the preparation of legislation by the division and for planning and implementation of programs by institutions and conferences.
Division III members affirm the purposes and fundamental policy of the NCAA, as set forth in Constitution Article I with emphasis on:	This section does not appear in the current statement.
Division III members shall establish and maintain an environment in which a student-athlete's activities are conducted with the appropriate primary emphasis on the student-athlete's academic experience.	This section does not appear in the current statement.
Division III intercollegiate athletics shall be conducted in a manner designed to protect, support and enhance the physical and mental health and safety of student-athletes.	This section does not appear in the current statement.
Division III members shall be committed to the creation of diverse and inclusive environments with respect for and sensitivity to the dignity of every person.	This section does not appear in the current statement.
Division III athletics shall be conducted in a manner free of gender bias.	This section does not appear in the current statement.



Amendment-to-Amendment.

- 2024-1-1.
 - o To amend the proposal to retain the language from the current philosophy statement regarding the focus of Division III athletics as a four-year undergraduate experience.
- 2024-1-2.
 - o To amend the proposal to retain the language from the current philosophy statement regarding awarding of financial aid to student-athletes.
 - > Division III does not award financial aid to any student based on athletics leadership, ability, participation or performance.







General Grouping



2024-2 Amendment-to-Amendment Period.

Current.

- The membership submits legislative proposals annually by July 15. Between July 15 and September 15, the initial sponsors may amend their original idea – by either expanding or restricting – the proposal.
- Between September 15 and November 1 additional amendments may be offered to change the proposal, however only those that further restrict the proposal are permitted (Bylaw 9.3.1.3).

2024-2 Amendment-to-Amendment Period.

Proposed.

• During the period of time between September 15 and November 1, sponsors of the original proposal would be permitted to offer amendments to either expand or restrict proposal.

2024-3 Minimum Participants in Tennis.

Current.

- As a condition of DIII membership, institutions must sponsor a minimum number of sports during each academic year.
- For individual sports, successful sponsorship of a sport includes both a minimum number of contests and a minimum number of participants at those contests.
- In tennis, that means at least ten contests with at least six participants (Bylaw 20.11.3.8).



2024-3 Minimum Participants in Tennis.

Proposed.

• The minimum number of participants to permit a tennis match to be counted for sports sponsorship purposes would decrease from six to four.



2024-4 Stunt as an Emerging Sport.

Current.

- An emerging sport is a women's sport, recognized by the NCAA, which is intended to help institutions provide more athletics opportunities for women and see if the sport grows to championship level.
- To stay on the list, emerging sports must gain championship status within 10 years or show steady progress toward that goal (Bylaw 20.02.6.1).
- If an institution sponsors an emerging sport as a varsity team, it must apply the NCAA constitution and Division III bylaws, interpretations and other legislation to the team.
- Stunt is an emerging sport in Division I & Division II, but not in Division III.



2024-4 Stunt as an Emerging Sport.

Proposed.

 Stunt would be added to the emerging sports list in Division III and legislation related to playing and practice seasons and membership would be established.

Other AMA Updates



Mental Health Hardship Waiver.

Pilot Program for 2023-24 and 2024-25 Academic Years.


- The Division III Management Council approved a pilot program specific to hardship waiver requests asserting a student-athlete's mental health condition.
- The pilot program will allow conference offices to work with the national office to collect information to determine if legislative change is warranted.
- Only requests for seasons charged during the 2023-24 and 2024-25 academic years will be processed through the pilot program.



Mental Health Hardship Waiver.

- Student-athlete cannot compete in more than **one-third** of the playing season.
- All competition must occur during first half of playing season.
- Contemporaneous or noncontemporaneous medical documentation from a licensed practitioner who is qualified to provide mental health services.
 - Must demonstrate that the student-athlete's mental health condition occurred during the season in question, occurred before completion of the first half of the traditional playing season, and prevented the studentathlete from competing in more than one-third of the traditional playing season in that sport.


Mental Health Hardship Waiver.

What Will Be Reported.

- Number of approved and denied hardship waivers asserting a mental health condition.
- Specific to approvals:
 - > Whether the documentation was contemporaneous or noncontemporaneous.
 - > The licensure of the practitioner who provided the documentation.
- Specific to denials:
 - > Which criteria were not met (i.e., legislated limit, first-half requirement, documentation).
