

What Happens on Friday Morning?

 Each active institution and multisport conference, as well as National SAAC, gets one vote.

• If a proposal is **adopted**, legislation changes as of the Effective Date.

If a proposal is defeated, legislation does not change.



Presidential Grouping



2025-1: National SAAC Composition.

Current.

- All multisport conferences and the group of independent institutions have a partner.
- Partner pairings alternate three-year terms on National SAAC as the primary member.
- Primary members attend all SAAC meetings, associate members attend January and July meetings.



2025-1: National SAAC Composition.

Proposed by: ARC & GNAC.

- Allow each multisport conference and the group of independents to have a primary representative on National SAAC.
- Using current numbers, this proposal would increase the committee from 21 to 42 student-athletes.



2025-2: Multisport Conference Size.

Current.

 To establish, or maintain, active Division III status, a multisport conference must have a minimum of seven institutions.



2025-2: Multisport Conference Size.

Proposed by: UMAC, Coast-to-Coast & NCAC.


Decrease the minimum number to six institutions.

 Align requirements with those for a single sport conference and AQs status for Division III Championships.


Proposed by: Management Council (ILC).

















Can increase modification:

- Sponsors of original proposal;
- Four member conferences:
- 20 institutions from at least four conferences; or
- Management or Presidents Council (by a ¾ vote)



NOT 2025-4:

Postbaccalaureate Participation Exception.

 The proposal has been referred by Presidents Council back to the governance structure.

2025-4: Federated Playing Rules.

Current.

PLAYING RULES & DIVISION III

What is a playing rule?

Playing rules are what happens on the field, court, pool, pitch, mat, rink, lane. track or slope when an opponent and officials are present. Playing rules are not what hap-pens during recruiting or practicing, or while working on compliance issues or NCAA championship policies.

What is the difference between a common rule and a federated rule?

A common rule is consistent across all three divisions, while a federated rule allows for differences by division.

What is the common rule making process and who is involved?

Every two years, each sport undergoes a Playing Rules Cycle.



Yes. In October 2024 Management Council created a subcommittee to further inform and advise the Division III members of playing rules committees and PROP regarding potential impact of rules proposals on Division III

Can any playing rule be federated?

While PROP has suggested that some rules areas are integral to competition and should remain common for all divisions, it has also acknowledged that there could be exceptions based on compelling reasons to federate a particular rule. Only the DIII members of PROP determine if a proposed rule that addresses one of the areas, below, has compelling

PROP has suggested that the following rules areas should be common:

 Rules with a health and safety impact • Field dimensions, court markings, permissible logos on the field/court • Scoring and timing rules, including rules surrounding overtime • Conduct/unsporting rules • Rules addressing penalty enforcement • Uniform rules • Equipment rules (ball/stick specifications, player equipment) • Technical rules (individual

PROP has suggested that the following rules areas could be federated or permissive:

· Halftime/intermission length · Allowable substitutions · Technology rules (instant replay, challenge review, technology on bench/sideline, etc.) • Rules identified as administrative that can be altered by mutual consent of the institutions involved in the contest



2025-4: Federated Playing Rules.

Proposed by: NCAC, AMCC, HCAC, LEC, MASCAC & PAC.

• Establish an additional process by which Division III may consider exempting itself from sport-specific playing rules that have either a financial or philosophical impact for institutions.

 Decision to exempt would be made by Management Council and ratified by the full membership at Convention.



2025-5: Reclassifying Process Waiver.

Current.

- Reclassifying institutions are coming to Division III from either Division I or Division II.
- The Division III Membership Committee oversees the reclassifying membership process, which currently takes three years to complete.



2025-5: Reclassifying Process Waiver.

Proposed by: Management Council (Membership).

- Provide an opportunity for a reclassifying member to request a waiver of Year Three and become active after Year Two.
- No membership requirements would change, but the reclassifying member would need to satisfy all requirements earlier in the process.
- The Division III Membership Committee would decide the waiver.



2025-6: Women's Wrestling.

Current.

- The sport of women's wrestling has been recognized on the Emerging Sports for Women list in Division III since 2023.
- Emerging sports must follow the Division III playing seasons rules and they may be used for sports sponsorship purposes.
- During 2023-24 76 NCAA institutions sponsored the sport and, for 2024-25, 93 institutions intend to sponsor.



2025-6: Women's Wrestling.

Proposed by: Management Council (CWA).

- Establish a National Collegiate Championship in women's wrestling, as well as a women's wrestling sport committee.
- If adopted by all three divisions, the proposal would be immediately effective with a planned first championship in 2026.


