


AVERAGE ROSTER REPORTED BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNING BODY

COMPETITION FORMAT

- Fifteens (15-a-side) is the World Cup format played primarily as a fall championship format.
- Sevens (seven-a-side) is the Olympic format, which is optionally played in the nonchampionship spring segment.

CHAMPIONSHIP STRUCTURE

- The top four teams in each division advance to the semifinals, with the highest seed hosting the tournament.
- Divisional winners are awarded at the joint divisional championships.

FACILITIES NEEDED

- A rugby field with synthetic turf is acceptable, but natural turf is preferred.
- For player welfare, a 5-meter runoff from the touchline is needed on the field.

PROSPECTIVE STUDENT-ATHLETES

- Girls youth and high school participation saw a 12% year-overyear increase (2022-23 to 2023-24).
- Rugby prospects include student-athletes whose primary sport is rugby, along with those who also compete in soccer, basketball, football and wrestling.
