

### 2020-21 Conference Grant Actions and Resources

#### Reminders

- 1. Unless a waiver has been approved or an exception granted as noted below, Conference Grant spending must meet current <u>policies and procedures</u>.
- 2. For questions about the grant or use of funds, contact the grant administrator, Ali Spungen.
- 3. Per the current policies and procedures, any spend beyond the listed preapproved items must have prior approval by the conference grant administrator, Ali Spungen.
- 4. No warning letters will be issued this year for failure to meet the requirements in any Tier due to COVID-19 impact.

# 2020-21 Flexibility Actions (as of Oct. 1, 2020)

- Conferences that received rollover funds for 2020-21 will be granted a one-year usage extension to August 1, 2022.
- Continue to provide flexibility in Tier Two and Tier Three funds (e.g., unspent Tier Two funds may be spent on preapproved items in Tier Three). For instance, if a conference has spent all its Tier Three funds, conferences may use Tier Two funds for Tier Three provided the funds are spent in a manner consistent with grant policies and practices. Per Conference Grant policies and procedures, it is already permissible to use Tier Three funds on permissible Tier One and Tier Two initiatives.

### Tier One

- Conferences may use Tier One funds on any preapproved Tier 2 or Tier 3 grant expense in 2020-21 grant cycle only. This included funds allocated for 2020-21 as well as Tier One funds that conferences rolled forward from previous years.
- Per conference grant policies and procedures, conferences must still:
  - Meet the requirement that at least \$200 per institution is spent on Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).
  - Spend no more than 25 percent of the Tier One annual funds, excluding rollover funds, on conference office personnel.
- For 2020-21, Tier One funds do not need to meet any constituent group minimums with the exception of SAAC (as noted above).

- Provide flexibility within Tier One for 2020-21 to allow conferences to use unspent funds allocated for one constituent group (e.g., SIDs) on any other preapproved constituent group (e.g., SWAs, FARs, ADRs, etc.).
- In order to allow conferences to conduct programming for constituent groups (e.g., FARs, SWAs), the policy of conducting conference-based events/programming once every three years, has been waived for 2020-21 grant cycle.
- Allow SAAC funds to provide leadership education for institutional SAAC leaders. Examples:
  - Provide campus SAAC officers with two to three leadership sessions, then follow-up with a conference-wide session with all campus officers, including the conference SAAC reps.
  - Provide campus-only SAAC leadership program/seminar.

# **Tier Three**

### Officiating

- For 2020-21, it is permissible for conferences to use either Tier Three (Officiating) or Tier Two (Student-Athlete Well-Being) funds to help cover COVID-19 testing for officials as recommended by the COVID-19 Medical Advisory Group.
- For 2020-21, Tier Three officiating funds may be used to offset additional assignor fees due to COVID-19 related changes and impacts on schedules.

### **Permanent Conference Grant Policy Updates**

# **Tier One**

- Printing of NCAA Manuals is now a preapproved item under Compliance and Rules Seminar Education.
- In addition to Women Leaders membership dues for campus SWAs (and conference office staff), CoSIDA membership dues are now a preapproved item in Tier One for campus SIDs (and conference office staff).

### Tier Two

• Tier Two funds (Student-Athlete Well-Being – Academic Awards) may be used to cover expenses for schools to start or continue chapters in Chi Alpha Sigma.

### 2020-21 Conference Grant Rollover Policy

• A conference may retain unused funds in excess of \$1,000 (beyond \$301 in any single tier) provided that the conference submits a detailed plan in the Impact Form (due Aug. 1) regarding how the excess funds will be used and the Strategic Planning and Finance Committee approves the plan.

Any funds beyond \$1,000 unspent, without an approved rollover plan, at the end of the subsequent year will need to be returned to the NCAA.

• Funds rolled over at the end of 2020-21 will remain within the respective Tier (e.g., excess funds from Tier One, must be rolled over to Tier One).
