Zaire also serves as a volunteer firefighter in his hometown. Some of his hobbies include working out/lifting, hiking and listening to music.




Brittany CrimminsEligibility Center


Marcel Diggs

Brandon Floyd


Leadership Development

Chelsea Lamberty, CPA


Administrative Services — Finance and Accounting Education: University of Wisconsin-Whitewater (B.B.A.), Temple University (M.S.)

In his free time, Brandon enjoys photography, reading, music, cooking and spending time with his family.




Mckenzie Maneggia Academic and Membership Affairs Education: Eastern Connecticut State University (B.S.)

Digital and Social Media, Championships and Alliances Education: Louisiana Tech University (B.S.)


